May 27, 2021

### CALL TO ORDER AND INTRODUCTIONS

- 1800/6:00 pm Microsoft Teams meeting called to order by Captain Sandoval. Introductions are done of all members and officials.

### CPAB BUSINESS:

- Approval of Minutes from February 25, 2021. Minutes approved.
- **Outreach Committee:** Looking at meeting. June 8, 2021.
- Crime Prevention Committee will be meet after June 15.
- **CPAB summit:** Commander Labrada requests all CPABs to submit ideas for Summit training topics to their civilian co-chairs by July.
- **Neighborhood Watch:** Training video available if anyone interested in starting a Watch group. Contact Co-chair.

### COUNCIL OFFICE UPDATE

- **CD1 Bill Cody** – Vaccine updates, ended in Glassell Park. Seventy-five percent of residents 90065 are vaccinated. Mobile units are moving into other areas. There is a June 15<sup>th</sup> deadline, more areas will be opening up. Doing Clean ups in the area around Northeast. 10 areas in Glassell Park tomorrow and surrounding areas. Thanks to Senior Lead Officers in the area.
- **City Attorney Office:** Briefed the Board on works in public transportation and gun violence. Discussed actions taken in regard to uptick in crime.
- working to bring our federal prosecutors into local offices in order to have federal attach bail to not enable those responsible to reoffend.
- **Bradley** –thanked all who participated in local vaccination mobile clinics: Glassell Park, NE officers, and Mt. Washington West Neighborhood Watch.

### CAPTAIN SANDOVAL:

- Violent crime, 9 in City which is an uptick in crime this Crime Report
- Property Crime - 3.3% reduction, 17 in the City in property crime
- 9 homicides compared to 5 last year

- 123 Aggravated Assaults/ From 106 last year
- 51 shootings/ from 21 last year
- 18 shots at people/ as compared to 15 last year
- Violent crime is up in Northeast and Prop 57, which will release 76k inmates is a concern. As a community, all need to review and fully understand when voting and as a community need to decide which way we are going and let our city officials know. Need to hold people accountable and need to have a balance. Us coming together as a community is important and need to move on this.
- The Homicide on May 20 was an isolated incident and was an argument and personal dispute. Three individuals shot, 1 passed away and 1 in bad condition and one grazed.
- May 18 Co chairs presented to the Board of Police Commissioners on what Northeast CPAB does. The Commission was very impressed on our community events in areas that were affected by violence. To continue this successful result, we will need to start getting our committees and initiatives going.
- The next meeting will be held in person at the police station and will also have the virtual option. June 16<sup>h</sup> the police office will resume normal operations.
- Thank you for everyone that is showing up every month and showing their support. We are documenting attendance., if not present at the four meetings or next will be removed from CPAB.

## SLO/CRO:

- **SLO Jesse Aispuro:** In Silver Lake fortunate not violent crimes. We are seeing auto theft and catalytic converters. To keep from being stolen there are prevention methods that are sometimes covered by insurance. Don't leave anything visible in the car so less of a target.
- **SLO Gina Paialii:** Close to 4<sup>th</sup> of July, if know of a house where fireworks are being exploded, contact the SLOs so that they can see them and handle this by. Elysian Valley and Echo Park, Local gangs coming out of the wood works a little bit, but nothing too much. Opening of Echo Park, Protocol? The park will close at 10pm, hired security and will continue enforcement. Has been peaceful.
- **SLO Mark Allen:** Double shooting, will be meeting with the apartment owner, put them at ease that it does not involve local gangs. On the 19<sup>th</sup> of May, there was a narcotic location located and gotten out, standing by on the court proceedings for abatement one. CD 1 is working with him to get the vacant lot location fenced. There is a dirt access pass, problem with encampments, want to get this sectioned off to curb property crime.
- **Sgt. Cesar Rivas:** First Annual LA River clean-up happening this summer, getting this organized and will be a community event and get a flyer put out.
- **SLO Lloyd Chang:** There was a burglary of a vehicle, we are working to improve the lighting in that area so that it will deter thefts from happening as well as improving the landscaping and lighting in the park to prevent crimes.
- **Board member Rosa Rivas:** Thanked Officer Chang for the work that has been done in Garvanza Park as it feels safer!

- **SLO Reyes:** Group in Cypress Park, the Huron Group of community members really helping to clean in that area. Gave attention to give thefts Ricardo from CD 1 is helping to organize a clean-up in the area.
